Ice Racing 2021 Season

(Revised Fall 2020)

1. Four Wheel Drive Vehicles Only

- A. All vehicles must be four (4) wheel drive or AWD (example: Jeep, Scout, Bronco, Blazer, etc.). No ATV's, Quads, UTV's, Golf Carts, etc.
- B. All vehicles must have only four (4) tires on the ice at one time. NO DUAL-WHEELED vehicles allowed.

2. Entry Fees

- A. All entry fees will be \$25.00 per driver, per class, for all ice race dates, including the Championship races. Entry fees are subject to change without notice.
- B. All entrants must register and pay online by noon the day before the first day of the event (typically this will be by noon on Friday). There will be no opportunity to register late or on-site. Registration website: <https://www.motorsportreg.com/orgs/our-gang-ice-racing>
- C. NO CHECKS ACCEPTED.
- D. NO REFUNDS will be given at any time. If you register online and pay via credit card and you wish to cancel your registration, or you are unable to make it to the event, a credit can be issued which may be applied to a future race during the same race season. These credits are no longer available once you have checked in at the event. Any credits remaining at the end of the season will be retained by OUR GANG 4 WHEELERS, INC.
- E. Entries for Dedicated Fun Days (held on specific Fridays) are \$25.00 per driver and \$5.00 per vehicle safety inspection, unless the vehicle receives a race tech inspection.
- F. Racing tech inspection fees are \$10.00 for all classes.
- G. No pre-pays allowed for special races (i.e. Go for the Gold, etc.)

3. Drivers' Requirements

- A. All drivers must possess a valid state driver's license, or learner's permit with a legal guardian present in the vehicle, and show proof of insurance. All drivers must show their license when going through registration; driver's license may be checked periodically at the officials' request. Minors under the age of 18 must have a parent or guardian present when signing the minor's waiver.
- B. Any driver suspected of being impaired or intoxicated will be disqualified from the day's events.
- C. First time Cheater class participants must make one lap (half-throttle) on the track under club supervision before the class starts.

4. Registration & Staging

- A. Registration:
 - 1. Drivers may check in for races only after the vehicle has received a tech inspection by the Tech Committee. Drivers may practice only after they have checked in and received their staging number(s).
 - 2. There may be four (4) drivers entered in the same vehicle, consisting of two (2) men and two (2) women; unless prior permission is obtained from Our Gang.
 - 3. A third driver can race in a vehicle with two (2) men and two (2) women if their vehicle breaks down after registering and prior to the start of their first heat. Three (3) drivers will be allowed in a class for the remainder of that weekend. The maximum number of drivers will be three (3) women and/or three (3) men per vehicle.
 - 4. All registered drivers must attend each day's driver's meeting.
 - 5. Staging numbers will be assigned randomly.

6. A maximum of 200 entrants will be allowed to register each day (including dedicated Fun Days) or at the discretion of Our Gang.
7. You can race any two divisions on any day.

B. Staging:

1. All drivers are responsible for promptly reporting to and lining up in the staging lines. When a driver's number is called and his/her vehicle is already on the race course or in the staging line, the driver or their representative must stand in his/her place in line.
2. If Center Ice and Head of Staging are ready to begin a heat, the driver(s) and/or crew member(s) must be lined up and ready or they WILL be disqualified. It is the responsibility of the driver to notify the Head of Staging of any problems.
3. If a vehicle must withdraw from the races for any reason, the driver(s) and/or crew member(s) MUST report all numbers to be scratched to the head staging official and/or the head registration official immediately.
4. The Staging officials will be responsible for monitoring time allowances for cool-downs, breakdowns and/or tire changes. Any request for any time allowance must be reported to the staging officials immediately. The driver and/or crew member must declare if it is a cool-down or mechanical breakdown.
5. The Staging and/or the Center Ice Official will halt all racing whenever deemed necessary for safety, mechanical, or technical reasons.
6. While not on the track, vehicle speed will not exceed an idle. Receiving a driver's meeting reminder is considered a warning. Any driver exceeding this speed limit will be disqualified from racing for the day or upon referee's decision.
7. Should both drivers in a vehicle have numbers which stage up together, they must run off. There will be no switching of positions to prevent a run off. The runoff can be done by times or one of the drivers may choose to use another vehicle for this round only.
8. The Head of Staging Official has discretion of which Our Gang approved bracket is used.

5. The Races

- A. Race elimination will be run in heats of two (2) vehicles each. A time limit for the completion of each heat will be up to the discretion of the Center Ice Official.
- B. The vehicle must complete the entire course in order to win a heat. The win will be judged by the first vehicle to cross the finish line; further defined as the first point of the vehicle across without any of the vehicle contacting a finish line cone. Should a vehicle running a heat break down or become stuck, the Center Ice Official shall determine if it is safe for the other vehicle in the heat to complete the course and shall instruct the vehicle to complete the course. If the Center Ice Official determines it is not safe to complete the course, the Center Ice Official shall determine the other vehicle as the winner.
- C. The means of starting a race will be determined by Center Ice.
- D. If a vehicle contacts a pylon, leaves the marked course (i.e. passes a gate, cuts a corner or endangers course workers), the driver loses the heat. If the track crew identifies a safety issue the driver will be stopped, and it will be an automatic loss (i.e. de-beaded tire, tire blowout or unlatched hood).
- E. Any time a double loss occurs during the trophy bracket, the drivers will be re-run to determine a winner.
- F. If a driver is unable to finish the heat due to mechanical trouble, this is considered a loss of that round. If a driver's vehicle is withdrawn from racing due to mechanical trouble before that driver's first heat, he/she may transfer his/her number to another vehicle qualified for that class or division. The referees and the staging officials must be made aware of the change immediately.

- G. The Center Ice Official has control over where the vehicles line up at the starting gate.
- H. There will be no delay or restart of any heat once a driver has indicated they are ready, unless deemed necessary by Center Ice.
- I. The driver's window on all vehicles must be completely rolled down or removed for the entire heat to enable the driver and race officials to see and hear one another.
- J. The pairing of two (2) vehicles does not occur until the ready nod is given to the Center Ice Official.
- K. Any forward tire movement of a vehicle prior to the go signal, after the Center Ice Official has received a ready nod from both drivers, will be black-flagged.
- L. If a driver's seat belt comes undone more than once per race day they will be disqualified unless deemed otherwise by an official.
- M. The start gate will be 20 feet wide (25% more room). If any part of the vehicle hits a pylon at the start, the driver will lose that round.
- N. When crossing the finish line all drivers must keep at least one hand on the steering wheel and not look to see the checkered flag until their vehicle has slowed and completely cleared the track. The Center Ice Official will keep the flag raised until both drivers have cleared the track and can observe the flag.
- O. A rollover is considered a loss.
- P. Passengers
 - 1. The driver and one (1) passenger will be allowed in the vehicle while competing in all classes with the exemption of the Street division where children can be additional passengers as long as they are in size appropriate restraint systems and allowed at the discretion of staging.
 - 2. NO passengers are allowed in the Cheater class.
- Q. Cool Downs/Break Downs/Tire Changing
 - 1. A time allotment of three (3) minutes for a cool down will be given as necessary, per heat, there is no limit to the number of cool downs allowed.
 - 2. Break down times are ten (10) minutes per vehicle, per class. Drivers must be at Head of Staging, race ready, before ten (10) minutes expires.
 - 3. Tire changing, including flats, when permitted by the specific class and division rules and approved by the referees and/or Tech Committee, shall not exceed ten (10) minutes or at the discretion of the officials.

6. Practicing

- A. There is no guarantee of practice time. Practice will be held only if sufficient time, conditions and referees allow. Practice may be limited to 2 laps per person or may be closed at any time at the discretion of Our Gang.
- B. Practicing will be allowed only after each vehicle's drivers have all checked in and received their staging number(s).
- C. A practice track may remain open under the discretion of the Officials.
- D. There will be no practicing on Championship days while other races are in progress.
- E. All other race rules apply.

7. Trophy Winners

- A. Awards will be given for first (1st) through fifth (5th) place (number of entrants permitting).
- B. All divisions will hold a point race based off regular season events. The top point earner and the runner-up will be recognized in the Championship Points race.

- C. Points are accrued by driving in a regular season class. They are awarded as follows:
 - 1. 1st Place.....5 points
 - 2. 2nd Place.....4 points
 - 3. 3rd Place.....3 points
 - 4. 4th Place.....2 points
 - 5. 5th Place.....1 point
- D. Our Gang does not recognize ties in the point races. In the event of a tie, the following tie breakers will be applied in this order:
 - 1. The driver with the most first place finishes.
 - 2. The driver with the most second place finishes.
 - 3. The driver with the most third place finishes.
 - 4. The driver with the most fourth place finishes.
 - 5. A two (2) lap tie-breaking race will be run between the tied drivers.
- E. Any awards or trophies not picked up by the awards banquet will be donated back to the general fund.

8. Protests

- A. Protests will only be accepted by the President for mechanical or safety equipment violations or other cheating. The decisions of the officials and referees are final and cannot be protested.
- B. Protests may ONLY be made by the driver(s) involved and must be made prior to next pairing.
- C. Valid protests must be accompanied by a \$50.00 cash deposit. If the protest is upheld, the deposit will be returned. If the protest is denied, the deposit will be retained by OUR GANG 4 WHEELERS, INC. for defrayment of costs.

9. Cheating

- A. A fine of \$100.00 and/or banishment from further races held by OUR GANG 4 WHEELERS, INC. will be imposed on any person caught cheating. No trophies will be awarded. These decisions will be made at the discretion of the referees.

10. The Referees

- A. The referee reserves the right to interpret these rules as necessary, to bar intoxicated/impaired or disorderly persons from competition, to rule in the interests of general safety and on all other unforeseen points of controversy as they may arise. All decisions of these referees will be final.
- B. The referee meaning pertinent committee heads.

11. Vehicle Specifications/Safety Equipment

(See specific Division for additional requirements)

- A. The suspension must be able to support the vehicle without bottoming out and be able to safely negotiate the race course.
- B. All vehicles must be self-starting.
- C. All vehicles must have a positive on/off ignition switch within easy reach of all of the vehicle's drivers.
- D. All vehicles must have at least a 12 ounce radiator coolant overflow can.
- E. All pedals must be of non-skid material.
- F. Steering wheel diameter may not be less than 12 inches and securely fastened.
- G. All vehicles must have correct steering geometry and sufficient brakes to stop the vehicle.
- H. All carburetors must be covered, hoods required.
- I. All fuel lines must be in good condition and securely mounted.
- J. Loose or liquid ballast must be securely mounted to the vehicle at the discretion of the Tech Committee.

- K. All gas cans, loose tires and unsecured items must be removed from any vehicle before entering the staging line. All tow bars must be removed or secured in place to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee.
- L. All automatic shifters must be equipped with a positive reverse lockout device secured to the shifter/transmission (not to the frame).
- M. Wheel studs must extend through the rim by at least one-half inch (1/2"). All alloy wheels must use appropriate lug nuts.
- N. Nitrous oxide must be mounted outside of the driver's compartment.
- O. All vehicles must retain OEM (factory type) frame that was produced in quantities of 1,000 or more. Frames that have been altered, reinforced, or have lightened front and rear cross members are allowed. In any Studs and Cheater class vehicles, no outside dimensions of the frame may be altered (widening, shortening, lengthening, etc.) by more than two (2) inches. Dimensions must be within one (1) inch of factory wheelbase for frame claimed. This rule is exempt for all bare rubber classes.
- P. All vehicles must have four (4) operable brakes except for Competition Class where steering brakes are allowed.
- Q. Seat belts are MANDATORY in all classes. Seats must be bolted to the floor or frame. Non-stock seats must be braced, framed or supported. Seat belts must be in good condition; no discolored, frayed or torn seat belts.
- R. Snell approved helmets are MANDATORY in the Competition division. DOT approved helmets are MANDATORY in the Pro Street Studs Division. Snell approved helmets are recommended for Pro Street and Street divisions. All helmets should be appropriate size and be worn in the proper manner. All helmets will be checked during tech inspection.
- S. Neutral safety switches are MANDATORY on all automatic transmissions. Scatter shields and transmission blankets are recommended on all transmissions.
- T. The vehicle must have a full front clip; metal, fiberglass or composite body panels; and a properly installed firewall. This includes complete flooring in the driver's compartment with all holes plugged.
- U. The battery and fuel system must be secured to the satisfaction of the tech committee.
- V. At the discretion of the Tech Committee, if a problem is not performance enhancing or a safety issue, a driver will be given until the next race to correct it.
- W. Recommended Equipment:
 - 1. Fire extinguisher.
 - 2. A full circumference front and rear driveline loop located approximately at the center of the driveline.
 - 3. Arm restraints, a side bar with a window net covering at least 60% of the driver's side opening, and padding on the roll cage around, over and behind the driver's head.
 - 4. Neck braces are strongly recommended, but not mandatory for classes using helmets.
 - 5. A marked or easily accessible tow hook or recovery point.

12. Street Divisions

A. Street Vehicles / Safety Equipment

1. All vehicles must be licensed and registered for use on public roads, including license plates and emission and/or inspection stickers. Valid registration and current license plates must be shown during tech inspection. Registration must match VIN.
2. Vehicles must be raced in street legal form with mufflers, windshields or eye protection, applicable state inspections, etc.

Referee interpretation/clarification of Rule 12.A.2.

For the purposes of these rules, the term "street legal" refers to vehicles that are licensed, registered, and insured for use on public roads, including license plates and emission and/or inspection stickers. In addition to the requirements in Rule 11, street legal vehicles must have complete bodies, hoods, fenders, bumpers, windshield, mirrors, headlights, and taillights with functional brake lights, all in acceptable condition.

3. Brakes must be of factory type; no alterations or modifications of any kind are allowed. All brake controls must be declared, disconnected and rendered inoperative to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee and the referees. The tightening of brakes on one side of the vehicle is considered brake control. The use of a factory emergency brake is allowed in Street classes as long as it remains unaltered as outlined above.
4. Helmets are not required in this division, but are strongly recommended to be worn with at least a Snell rating.
5. Roll bars or factory hard tops are MANDATORY.

The following section has been amended. Please refer to the 2021 Rule Book Amendments.

B. Bare Rubber Division

1. No tire changing is allowed on or between vehicles during class eliminations except for a flat or blowout. All tire changes must be cleared by an Our Gang official.
2. Tires must be factory produced and DOT approved for use on public roads.
3. Specialty ice tires are allowed (i.e. Blizzak, soft compound, etc.).
4. Tires that came studded and have been de-studded are permitted.
5. No traction modifiers are allowed (i.e. walnut shells, bottle caps, bleach or any foreign materials).
6. Siping is allowed. Buffing and grooving of tires will not be allowed.
7. Minimum air pressure allowed is 10 lbs. per tire.
8. Minimum tread width allowed is 4 inches.
9. Go for the Bronze Race
 - a. Maximum of four (4) entrants per vehicle.
 - b. This will be a single elimination race with men and women combined.
 - c. This is a two-lap race.
 - d. All other Street Bare Rubber rules apply.

C. Studs Division

1. No tire changing is allowed on or between vehicles during class eliminations except for a flat or blowout. All tire changes must be cleared by an Our Gang official.

2. Tires must be factory produced and DOT approved for use on public roads. Tires designed for ice racing will be placed in Pro Street Division Studs as long as they meet the rules for that division.
3. Studs must be of factory type. No handmade or altered studs are allowed.
4. The maximum stud length allowed is 17mm (.668 of an inch). If the Tech Committee has any doubt about a stud, it will be pulled out for inspection.
5. A maximum of 10 studs per 40 sq. inches will be allowed, as measured by a 7 1/8" round template.
6. Tires should be in good condition and the studs secured to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee. Studs should be installed according to factory specifications and in factory drilled holes only. Studs may not protrude more than 1/16" from the tread of the tire.
7. Minimum tread width allowed is 4 inches.
8. Minimum tire pressure allowed is 10 lbs. per tire.
9. This is an example of the design of a stud allowed. If you have a different stud, it must be approved by Our Gang prior to attending the event.



Referee interpretation/clarification of Rule 12.C.

To fully accommodate all studded tires that are DOT approved for use on public roads: *Studded tires that are factory-produced by a tire manufacturer that are DOT approved for use on public roads (such as the Nokian Hakkapeliitta 9) may be used. These tires must retain the original amount and type of stud installed at time of manufacture and must not be modified. If the tire manufacturer is any other than Nokian, it is the entrant's responsibility to provide supporting documentation of stud type and stud count for any such tire. Studdable tires that are DOT approved for use on public roads in which studs are installed subsequent to the manufacturing process may also be used. These tires must retain the number of holes molded into the tire's tread design from the factory and must not be modified; studs installed in said holes may not protrude more than 1/16" from the tread of the tire. Retread tires are not permitted. All tires meeting these specifications will be exempt from the maximum stud count specified in Rule 12.C.5.*

13. Pro Street Divisions

A. Pro Street Vehicles / Safety Equipment

1. All vehicles must be licensed and registered for use on public roads, including license plates and emission and/or inspection stickers. Valid registration and current license plates must be shown during tech inspection. Registration must match VIN.
2. Vehicles must be raced in street legal form with mufflers; applicable state inspections; DOT headlights, taillights, turn lights; etc.

Referee interpretation/clarification of Rule 13.A.2.

For the purposes of these rules, the term "street legal" refers to vehicles that are licensed, registered, and insured for use on public roads, including license plates and emission and/or inspection stickers. In addition to the requirements in Rule 11, street legal vehicles must have complete bodies, hoods, fenders, bumpers, windshield, mirrors, headlights, and taillights with functional brake lights, all in acceptable condition.

3. Brakes must be of factory type; no alteration or modifications of any kind are allowed. All brake controls must be declared, disconnected and rendered inoperative to the satisfaction of the Tech committee and the referees. The tightening of brakes on one side of the vehicle is

considered brake control. The use of a factory emergency brake is allowed in Pro Street classes as long as it remains unaltered as outlined above.

4. A minimum of a DOT approved helmet is MANDATORY in the Studs class in the Pro Street division. Snell approved helmets are recommended. Helmets are not required in Bare Rubber class, but they are recommended.
5. Roll bars or factory hard tops are MANDATORY in Pro Street. Full roll cages are recommended for the Studs class.

The following section has been amended. Please refer to the 2021 Rule Book Amendments.

B. Bare Rubber Division

1. This division has been discontinued due to the expansion of the Street Bare Rubber Division.

C. Studs Division

1. Rally type ice racing tires produced with the studs installed and/or molded into the rubber at the factory are allowed, but must meet the following requirements:
 - a. Tires must be chosen from the following list and are to be used “as is” and as sold by the manufacturer.
 - Pirelli – Sottozero Ice, Sottozero Ice 1, WR3, WR5, WR6, WJ, WJA, J, J1, ASW1, ASW3, ASW4, ASW4-1
 - Michelin – NA00, NA01, GE00 (with "Swedish" style studs, not Monte Carlo); some of these tires were also marketed as X-Ice North 3 and X-Ice North NA01 for FIA
 - Black Rocket – BR41, BR50, BR90, BR110, BR120
 - BFGoodrich – ICE C11, ICE GA1, ICE GE1
 - DMACK – DMG-ICE, DMG-ICE2, DMG-ICE3
 - Hankook – SR10, SR10W
 - Continental – IceRacingContact
 - Yokohama – A040, A040S
 - Avon – W77, B3, B5, W6, W6 version 2, W7, VRC10, VRC11, Grissly 12
 - b. Max stud length is 20mm and stud protrusion from the tread can not exceed 7mm.
 - c. Hand cutting or modification of the tread pattern is not permitted.
 - d. Any chemical and/or mechanical treatment of tires is prohibited.
 - e. The interior of the tire must be filled only with air.
 - f. Any device designed to clamp the tire to the rim is not permitted (i.e. beadlock).
 - g. If the tire you want to use is not specifically listed in Rule 13.C.2.a., you must contact club officials for approval before racing with the tires.
 - h. If the tires listed in Rule 13.C.2.a. lose a stud(s) while racing, it is acceptable to replace the missing stud(s) with a #10 AMA Kold Kutter screw or #12 Canadian Kold Kutter screw, inserted from the outside with nylock or flanged nut on the inside.
2. Custom-built studded tires are allowed, but must meet the following requirements:
 - a. Studs must be of factory type. No handmade or altered studs are allowed. No Alaskan studs are allowed.
 - b. The maximum stud length allowed is 20 mm (.786 of an inch). If the Tech Committee has any doubt about a stud, it will be pulled out for inspection.

- c. A maximum of 20 studs per 40 sq. inches will be allowed, as measured by a 7 1/8" round template.
 - d. Minimum tread width allowed is 4 inches. Maximum tread width allowed is 12.5 inches as stamped on the side of the tires.
3. Tires should be in good condition and the studs must be secured to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee.
 4. No tire changing is allowed on or between vehicles during class eliminations except for a flat or blowout. All tire changes must be cleared by an Our Gang official.
 5. Minimum tire pressure allowed is 10 lbs. per tire.

D. Go for the Silver Race

1. Maximum of four (4) entrants per vehicle.
2. This will be a single elimination studded tire race with men and women combined.
3. This is a two-lap race.
4. All other Pro Street Studs Class rules apply.

14. Competition Division

A. Vehicle Specifications/ Safety Equipment

1. Competition division vehicles do not have to be street legal.
2. Front and rear axles must remain same type (i.e. solid or independent) as frame claimed.
3. Steering brakes are allowed in the Competition division.
4. Snell approved helmets are MANDATORY in all classes of the Competition Division.
5. Full roll cages are MANDATORY to compete in the Studs and Cheater classes. Roll bars or a factory hardtop are MANDATORY to compete in the Bare Rubber classes only.
6. A safety approved 5-point harness is MANDATORY to compete in the Cheater Class.
7. Front roll cage mounts must be securely fastened to the frame.
8. Scatter shields are MANDATORY on manual transmissions. Blankets are recommended for all transmissions.
9. Any fuel tank or fuel cell with an open vent tube or hose must have a one-way check valve in Cheater Class vehicles.
10. The fuel filler neck must be outside any tano cover. The tano cover can be removed, but the fuel neck must be visible.
11. On Cheater Class vehicles a battery ignition disconnect switch must be wired such that when engaged it will isolate all battery power to electronic circuits and kill the engine. This switch must be placed in the rear of the vehicle, so that it can be turned off from outside the vehicle. This switch must also be marked in bright, contrasting colors.
12. Cheater vehicles may not have glass windows.

B. Bare Rubber Tire Specifications

1. Siping, buffing and grooving of tires is allowed.
2. No traction modifiers allowed (i.e. walnut shells, bottle caps, bleach or any foreign materials).
3. Minimum tread width allowed is 4 inches.

C. Stud Tire Specifications

1. Minimum tread width allowed is 4 inches. Maximum tread width stamped on side of the tire allowed is 12.5 inches.
2. Minimum air pressure allowed is 10 lbs. per tire.
3. Rally type ice racing tires produced with the studs molded into the rubber at the factory are not allowed (i.e. BF Goodrich, Continental, Dunlop, Michelin, etc.).
4. The maximum stud length allowed is 20 mm (.786 of an inch). If the Tech Committee has any doubt about a stud, it will be pulled out for inspection.
5. A maximum of 20 studs per 40 sq. inches will be allowed, as measured by a 7 1/8" round template.
6. No more than nine (9) studs per bar.
7. No tire changing is allowed on or between vehicles during class elimination except for a flat or blowout. All tire changes must be cleared by an Our Gang Official.
8. Tires should be in good condition and the studs must be secured to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee.

D. Go for the Gold Race

1. Maximum of four (4) entrants per vehicle.
2. This will be a single elimination, studded tire race with men and women combined.
3. This is a two lap race.
4. All other Competition Studs rules apply.

E. Cheater Tire Specifications

1. Tires run must be bolted tires and have a minimum of 3 bolts per tire.
2. Tire changing may be at will. A time allotment of only ten (10) minutes will be allowed for tire changing.
3. Tires should be in good condition and the bolts must be secured to the satisfaction of the Tech Committee.
4. The bolts in cheater tires may not exceed 1/8" over 1 1/2" in length from the "tread" surface, to be determined by a 20% average. Any diameter bolt is allowed.

F. The Cheater Invitational

1. This race will consist of sixteen (16) drivers. There will be eight (8) women's point's leaders in Cheaters and eight (8) men's point's leaders in Cheaters.
2. If less than eight (8) men's and/or women's drivers are able to qualify, empty positions will be randomly drawn to fill the vacancy(ies).
3. All rounds follow bracket style racing.
4. One winner must emerge from each bracket (i.e. a bye-round, if necessary. A bye-round is a free lap and must be made).
5. Drivers may substitute vehicles at their discretion between races if a breakdown occurs in their primary vehicle.
6. Starting positions will be determined by drawing numbers the night before at the trophy presentation.
7. There will be two (2) start/finish flaggers on each side of the track.
8. Invitational drivers will choose race workers the night before at the trophy presentation.
9. No additional fees are required.
